Brother Knights,

Living Blessed: How Faith, Effort, and Purpose Turn Every Kind of Luck into Grace

In life's unpredictable flow, luck appears in many forms — some random, some earned, some illusory, and some moral. Philosophers and psychologists categorize these as chance luck, merit-based luck, perceived luck, and moral luck. Each represents a different way fortune influences human experience. From a Christian perspective, these expressions of luck are neither to be feared nor worshipped but approached with a trifold response: force, focus and faith.

Chance luck, the raw unpredictability of life, is most visible in events like natural disasters, illnesses, or sudden windfalls. As Christians, we do not deny these events, but place them within the broader framework of divine providence. Faith as the guiding response — the belief that even in randomness, God's will and wisdom are at work. As Romans 8:28 declares, "All things work together for good for those who love God." Faith transforms randomness into trust.

Merit-based luck seems to reward hard work when opportunity arises — a student aces an exam because they studied thoroughly. Here, as Christians we engage not just with faith but with force — the will to act, to strive, to steward their gifts. "Faith without works is dead" (James 2:17) speaks directly to this: good fortune may come, but it is often the fruit of effort shaped by grace.

Perceived luck refers to the illusion that some people are simply "luckier" — often because they are more optimistic, open, or resilient. Christians cultivate focus — a disciplined spiritual outlook rooted in hope and humility. What others call luck, the faithful recognize as a mindset refined by prayer, gratitude, and attentiveness to God's presence in everyday life.

Finally, moral luck raises questions of justice: why is one person praised or blamed for outcomes largely outside their control? As Christians our responses blends all three — faith in God's ultimate justice, force in striving to live righteously regardless of outcome, and focus in remaining morally centered amid life's ambiguities. The example of Job stands here: a man judged by others for his suffering, yet ultimately vindicated by his integrity and God's wisdom.

In summary, while the world may call it luck, as Christian we see something deeper — a call to live with faith in God, to apply force in moral effort, and to maintain focus on eternal truth. In this light, even misfortune becomes meaningful, and fortune becomes a tool for service rather than pride.

The faith director, appointed by the grand knight, is responsible for all faith based council programs. The faith director coordinates with other officers and directors to support the knight's principles of charity, unity, fraternity and patriotism centered through the base value of Cor (The word "Cor" is Latin for "heart" and is also the root of the word "courage").

Programs support the knights, their families and parish ministries. Emphasis to supporting our youth in their Christian journey is facilitated by working with our knights, who exemplify Catholic faith and culture.

Some great examples currently seen in our faith-based services are dedicated to:

- 1. Serving our families in fellowship and friendship with donuts after mass. (Service hours for our youth is encouraged).
- 2. Supporting breakfasts twice a year for our Boy Scouts and once a year for our Cub Scouts.

 (Both Donuts and Boy Scout Breakfasts represent 20 days donated to our parish)
 - 3. Organizing youth support for service hours over the 6 weeks of Fish Fry.
- (Our young men and women help with soft drinks, desserts, cleanup and support of our guest-inneed to their tables).
- 4. We currently added donut support for the parish Easter Egg Hunt (we saved money on Easter Buddy, he doesn't eat donuts!).
- 5. We serve lunches for our 7th and 8th grade pre-confirmation retreats and support the monthly meeting with set-up as requested.
 - We also get the opportunity to address the teens and parents once a year about the Knights of Columbus.
 - 6. There is knight support for St. Mary's Food Kitchen once a month and Shalom House every other month.
 - 7. Organizing and performing the street cleanup once a quarter.
 - (A tremendous time for Dads and their sons to serve together.)
 - 8. Supporting 3 Seminarians with cards and annual financial gifts at Christmas.
 - 9. Praying the rosary prior to every general meeting and bringing council awareness to other church opportunities for adoration.
- 10. Bringing the council together in corporate communion. Support of other ministries such as Fire Retreat and TMIY.

As Faith activities only represent a portion of what our council sponsors;



Irenaeus c. 130 - c. 202 AD) was a Greek bishop noted for his role in guiding and expanding Christian communities in the southern regions of present-day France and, more widely, for the development of Christian theology by opposing Gnostic interpretations of Christian Scripture and defining protoorthodoxy. Originating from Smyrna, he had seen and heard the preaching of Polycarp, who in turn was said to have heard John the Evangelist. 

America's Parish Priest in America's Parish Church

A new statue of Blessed Michael McGivney finds a home in St. Patrick's Cathedral, reflecting the dynamic history of the Church in the United States.



Standing in the St. Joseph Chapel of St. Patrick's Cathedral in New York City, a new bronze statue graces the revered neo-Gothic masterpiece beloved as "America's Parish Church."

The slightly larger-than-life sculpture, crafted by artist Chas Fagan, depicts Blessed Michael McGivney clad in cassock and stole, imparting his priestly blessing. Commissioned for the cathedral by the Supreme Council and gifted by the Fourth Degree, the statue was presented with thousands of Knights of Columbus and family members looking on at the beginning of the celebration of the 125th anniversary of the Fourth Degree on Feb. 22.


