7909 Community Director Activity Brief

Give our council members opportunities to engage in charitable activities not associated with our parish i.e. Kansas City metropolitan area. Most are non-profit organizations.

Adopt-A-Street

Brief – In coordination with the Olathe Street Dept., pick up trash on both sides of Mur-Len Street from 143rd to 151st. In return the city of Olathe has installed a sign along Mur-Len recognizing our council.

When - 4 times a year, once every quarter, on a Saturday usually starting at 8:30AM (takes about an hour).

Volunteering – 4-6 volunteers needed each time, council contact typically asks for volunteers at officer and/or council meetings and by email if needed.

Homeless Uplift (uplift)

Brief - Volunteer to help an organization called 'Uplift' provide for the homeless in the Kansas City (MO & KS) areas. Uplift operates from a warehouse on Prospect Street just east of downtown Kansas City MO. Uplift drivers use large vans to go to where the homeless tend to gather. Prior to going out volunteers fill the vans with hot meals, clothes, toiletries, medicine, blankets etc.

Volunteers then get in the van and help hand out these items to the homeless. Volunteers need to bring an open heart, warm caring smile and if desired a willingness to have some conversation.

These people live on the fringes of society and we need to let them know we care.

When – 4 times a year, once every quarter, on a Saturday from 3:30PM to ~10PM (the ladder depends on how busy it is)

Volunteering - 4 volunteers needed each time, council contact typically asks for volunteers at officer and/or council meetings and by email if needed.

Habitat for Humanity (habitatkc) Build

Brief – Work with the local Habitat for Humanity organization to help build a home for a well-deserving needy person or family. The work isn't usually very strenuous but is labor intensive. No experience necessary. An on-site foreman will be there to help.

When - once a year on a Saturday, typically in spring or early summer

Volunteering – typically 8 volunteers are needed, a link with more details and to sign up if so desired will be emailed to all council members some time prior to the event.

Special Olympics Fundraiser (sometimes referred to as the tootsie roll drive or gig)
Brief – While handing out free tootsie rolls, volunteers silently give customers the opportunity to donate to the local Special Olympics. Proceeds help those in the area with mental and/or physical disabilities participate in the annual Kansas Special Olympics. This is a nationwide Knights of Columbus fundraiser open to all councils. Volunteers are typically stationed at 2 local grocery stores on Friday from 11AM to 6PM (2 hour shifts) and on Saturday from 8AM to 6PM (2 hour shifts) and on Sunday at Prince of Peace after all morning masses.

When – once a year, typically on the 2nd full weekend in October.

Shalom House Dinner

Brief – Proved dinner for the staff and formerly homeless men enrolled in the long-term program at Shalom House Men's Transitional Living Facility in Kansas City KS. After serving dinner volunteers are encouraged to join the residents in eating and fellowship.

When - 6 times a year, once every other month.

Volunteering – 3 to 5 needed each time, council contact typically asks for volunteers at officer and/or council meetings and by email if needed.

Project 1020 (project1020) Cold Weather Homeless Shelter

Brief – Located in Lenexa KS near 95th and Pfluum. Staffed by a wide swath of volunteers with guidance from experienced volunteers. The shelter provides security, a warm meal, bedding, privacy, clothing, hygiene, over the counter medicine and showers among other things. See above project 1020 link for more details and to sign up so desired. Volunteers need to bring an open heart, warm caring smile and if desired a willingness to have some conversation. These people live on the fringes of society and we need to let them know we care.

When – shelter is open from 6PM to 8AM December 1st to the end of March the following year.




Church Fathers



Clement of Alexandria c. 150 – c. 215 AD)

According to the 4th-century bishop Epiphanius, Titus Flavius Clemens was born into a pagan family in Athens. Clemens is today called Clement of Alexandria (c. AD 155-c. 220)—his city of residence is added to distinguish him from the earlier Clement of Rome. As a seeker of truth, Clement traveled through Greece, Italy, Syria, Palestine, and finally to Alexandria, Egypt. There he encountered the teacher of the Alexandria Catechetical School, Pantaenus, who presented him with the Christian message; Clement became a believer. He presented Christianity as a new philosophy in terminology that would appeal to Gnostics.
